CAMPBELL	<p>With almost 44,000 residents and a reputation for being one of the fastest growing areas in the State, the Campbell Area includes the neighborhoods of ʻEwa, East Kapolei, Honouliuli, Ocean Pointe, West Loch, and parts of Iroquois Point and Waipahu.</p>	Deleted: Barbers Point,
CENTRAL HILO	<p>The per capita income in the Central Hilo Area is lower than the State average, and the unemployment rate is slightly higher. More than 25% of the children 4 years and under are living in poverty. In a Statewide survey of 6th, 8th, 10th, and 12th graders, more than half of the adolescents responding in this community reported poor parental supervision.</p>	Deleted: 5
CENTRAL KAUAʻI	<p>The Central Kauaʻi Area is home to almost 23,000 residents in the neighborhoods served by the Kauaʻi High School Complex including Ko-loa, Poʻipu, Li-huʻe, Puhi, and Hanamaʻulu, as well as parts of ʻEleʻele and Kalaheo. The median age of 39.8 is in the highest 20% of communities in the State, as is the percentage of senior citizens over the age of 65. The ethnic makeup of the residents in Central Kauaʻi is similar to the rest of Hawaiʻi, except that Filipinos are found here in a higher proportion than in 80% of the communities Statewide. Only about 18% of the residents identify themselves as Hawaiian or Part-Hawaiian—slightly less than the State average.</p>	Deleted: <del>A relatively high proportion of senior citizens—more than one-third—live alone</del>
EAST KAUAʻI	<p>Almost 68% of the young children ages 5 and under have two working parents, yet almost 17% of young children live in poverty—a percentage that is higher than the State average. Consequently, a slightly higher percentage of East Kauaʻi Area families receive benefits such as food stamps and Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF), compared to the State as a whole. The per capita income is slightly lower than the State average, but the percentage of residents who own their own homes is higher.</p>	Deleted: that age
HANA	<p>For a community as small as Hana, it is important to keep in mind that a few unusual cases in the data can skew the results, causing the percentages to move to the high or low extremes. The per capita income of this area is almost 25% lower than the State as a whole, and approximately 30% of the children ages 4 and younger are living in poverty.</p>	Deleted: 5
HILO	<p>The per capita income in the Hilo Area is low, and the unemployment rate is higher than 85% of the communities in the State. More than 33% of children ages 4 and under are living in poverty.</p>	Deleted: 5
KING KEKAULIKE	<p>Most of the data for indicators of child and family well-being in this area are equal to or better than the Statewide averages, with a few exceptions. The percentage of children with health insurance coverage is lower than average, and the percentage of young children living in poverty is slightly higher than average. In a Statewide student survey, more than half of the adolescents responding in this community reported a lack of interest in school. The percentage of "idle teens" (not in school and not working) is higher than in most other communities.</p>	Deleted: ages 5 and under
MAUI	<p>The geographic area served by the Maui High School Complex includes Puʻune-ne-, Kaʻa-, Ki hei, Kahului, and parts of Wailuku. In this community of nearly 42,000 people, the median age is 37.5, with a slightly higher percentage of people ages 35-64 compared to the Statewide average. There is a higher percentage of Caucasians and a slightly lower percentage of Asians in this community. The majority of Asians here are Filipino.</p>	Deleted: Kahului
