

# Snapshot of Hawaii's Teens (ages 12 - 17)

There are about 112,000 teens ages 12 to 17 in Hawaii. 1

### **Economic Security**

- ✓ 31% live below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level<sup>2</sup>
- ✓ 21% live in a household headed by a single parent¹
- √ 31% of high-school students are certified for free or reduced-cost lunches<sup>3</sup>
- √ 10% of teens ages 16 -19 are not attending school and not working 4

#### Health

- √ 11% are without health insurance¹
- √ 843 girls a year under age 18 become pregnant<sup>5</sup>
- √ 11% of 15 to 17 year olds have asthma<sup>6</sup>

## Safety

- √ 900 a year are confirmed abused and/or neglected<sup>7</sup>
- √ 36 teens ages 15 -19 died from homicide, suicide, or accident in 20038
- √ 15% of adolescents report exposure to illicit drug use<sup>9</sup>

#### Education

- √ 82% of 9<sup>th</sup> graders graduate in four years<sup>10</sup>
- √ 7% of secondary-school students are absent on an average day¹¹
- √ 75% of public-school seniors have college plans<sup>3</sup>
- √ 45% of adolescents report a lack of interest in school¹¹¹
- ✓ 28% of 8<sup>th</sup> graders score below the basic reading level<sup>12</sup>
- √ 33% of 8<sup>th</sup> graders score below the basic math level<sup>12</sup>
